## MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

Why do we come to church on Sunday? What is the purpose of our attendance? What motivates you to attend services at St. John's? I remember Jim, a parishioner in my former parish, who explained that for years his reason for attending Trinity was business. He could see current clients and meet potential ones, and it was good for his image as a lawyer.

There are, obviously, some inappropriate reasons for participating in the Sunday services. Before maturing in the faith, Jim practiced one of those. On the other hand, there are helpful motivations that can encourage us to participate, but that should not become our primary motivation. Let me explain.

Typically, we attend St. John's to be with people we love, or because we are looking for a spiritual family. There is a power in the love of a Christian community that can lift our spirits and give us a good shot in the arm for the coming week. Friendships that include worshipping together often possess an extra quality, like adding a zesty spice to a dish.

Often we attend services to be consoled and comforted. We find in the liturgy a sense of hope that helps us meet the challenges and setbacks of life. There is so much bad news, so many reasons to be anxious and fearful. From the personal frustration of trying to untangle a bureaucratic mess, to global tragedies of wars and famines, we experience a constant procession of worry.

Church is a place where we can leave those cares and be unburdened from the guilt that weighs down our hearts. Last week a person who felt trapped by sin pronounced with great anguish that if he were to die that very moment he would not go to heaven. At church we can unburden our souls of that personal guilt and we can secretly admit to God our sense of inadequacy. We long to gain a sense that God takes that guilt and inadequacy away; we yearn to feel comfort, consolation and hope.

Often we attend church in order to provide a service to our children or to ourselves. They need to learn about God or to be instructed in proper morals, so we take them to church so that a teacher, youth leader or pastor can help raise them in the faith. Like our children, we also want to grow closer to God and to deepen our spiritual roots. We seek to know more about the Bible and to feel comfortable speaking about Jesus.

As you reflect on these reasons for attending church, you can recognize their merit, and I trust that you resonate with some or all of them. You might even add to the list. As good as these reasons are, the one essential motive is much more important. The real reason for going to church is to worship God. Our purpose is to glorify Jesus Christ. We gather in the name of Jesus Christ to love God and to serve in his name. To be even more specific, the main reason for participating in St. John's is to offer Christ our praise and adoration. We are here for God, not for ourselves or for our children.

If we worship on Sunday so that we can get something out of it, then we are putting ourselves first. Conversely, to stay home because last time we did not feel comfort, peace or happiness is a subtle way of putting ourselves ahead of God, as if our needs and happiness were more important. This is a subtle form of self-worship. When we worship in order to honor and glorify God, then we are putting God first and truly being Christ's body.

We need each other to be present, because together we can better glorify Christ and worship God. This is the true source of joy. A full house of prayer and singing makes a pleasing offering of thanksgiving. This Lent I exhort those of you who have lost the holy habit of regular attendance to return. I invite all of us to focus on the true purpose of attending St. John's.

One Bible passage that has become a type of mantra for me keeps me focused on the true meaning and purpose of my life. I know of a nun who has placed these words over the entrance to her cell, so that she sees them several times a day. May they also be a blessing to you this Lent and for the entire length of your days. "We who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live to the praise of his glory" (Ephesians 1:12).

Let us live to the praise of Christ's glory.

## FEBRUARY 10 A CELEBRATION WE WILL REMEMBER

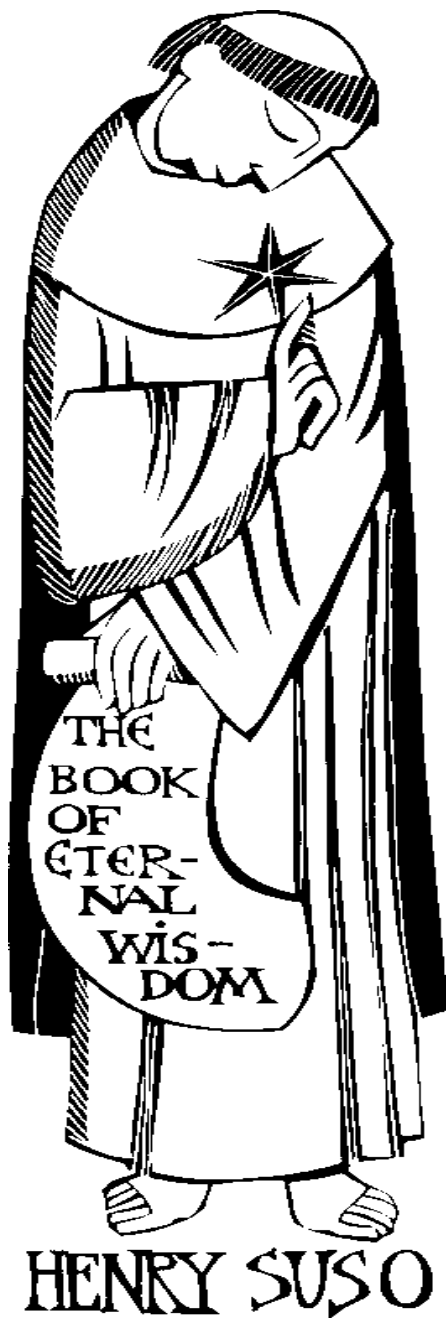

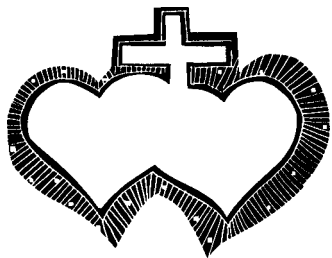

## PLEDGES MADE EASY

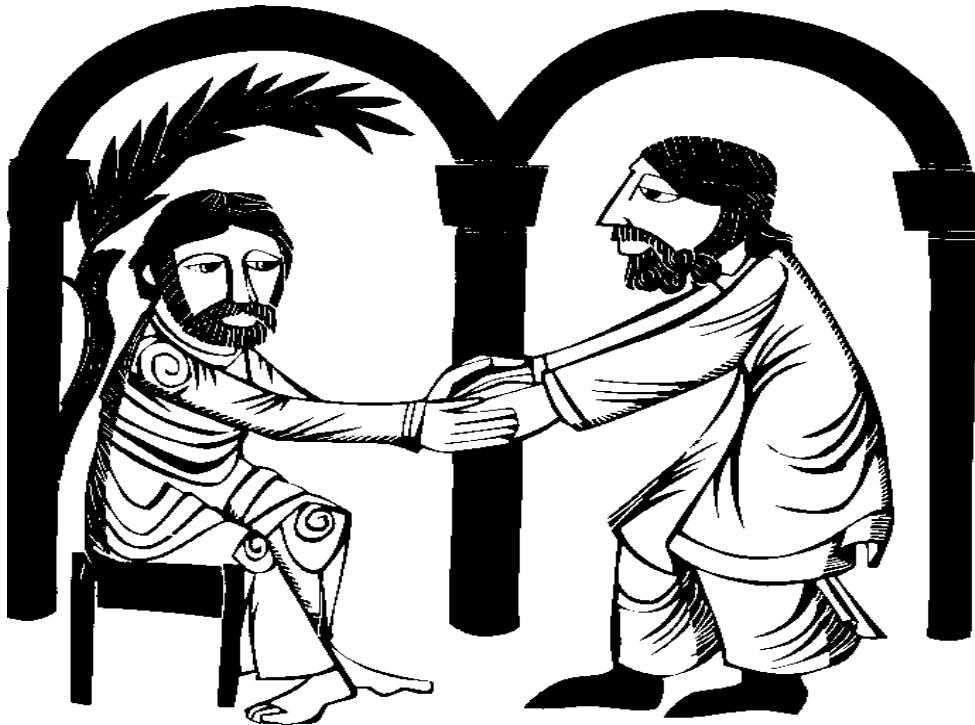
Save time, simplify your life, and support our parish! We're keeping up with the times by offering our members and friends a new way to help our ministry. Our new Electronic Giving program is an automated program which will allow you to make contributions without having to lift a pen to write a check or reach into your wallet for cash!

It is fast, safe and easy! In fact, it is less risky than checks, as it cannot be lost, stolen or destroyed, and the rate of accuracy is high. The electronic transfer will cost you NOTHING. St. John's will issue you a donation statement for your tax records, and your bank statements will provide you with a record of transfers as additional proof of your contributions. Donations via electronic transfer can be made to our general or building fund, or any fund you request.

Here is how it works:

You authorize a specified amount of money to be electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to St. John's account. You also specify the frequency of the transfer: weekly, monthly, quarterly, or annually. To sign up for this new giving option and have your donations transferred electronically to St. John's account on a regular basis, please stop by the office and fill out an authorization form.

You can always cancel your authorization of transfer at any time by notifying us in writing. But we believe that once you have enjoyed the convenience and savings of this new program, you won't want to go back.
